
The Neighbourhood Development Plan covers the whole parish, not just the village (please see the map, below).



Green spaces are any open spaces that are accessible to the public. This includes playing fields, sports pitches, wildlife areas, parks, community gardens, greens, playgrounds and cemeteries. The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) gives local communities the opportunity to protect very important green areas by designating them as 'Local green spaces'. This prevents them being built on in all but exceptional circumstances.
