## Bishop's Itchington Parish Council

#### **Parish Council Meetings**

Following the new Covid-19 national lockdown, the parish council is still holding its business meetings remotely via Zoom. The next meeting will be held on 8 February 2021 at 7.30pm - if you would like join this, please contact the clerk no later than 5.00pm on the day of the meeting to obtain the joining instructions. A copy of the agenda is always posted on the parish council notice board at the corner of Chapel Street and Poplar Road.

#### **Pavilion Project**

The working party meets every third Tuesday of the month at 7.30pm – next meeting will be held on 16 February 2021. Everyone is welcomed to attend but during the national lockdown, these meetings will continue to be held on zoom – joining instructions can be found on Bishop's Itchington Parish Council web site. Progress is continuing and funding applications are being drawn up.

#### **Children's Play Area/Tennis Courts**

The broken mini crawl/scramble net will be replaced this month with a new piece of equipment as voted for in our Facebook poll. The working group is still meeting on a regular basis to look at a staged refurbishment of the playground over the next three years. It has been disappointing to see the number of empty cans and bottles that have contained alcoholic beverages being strewn around the children's playground and on the tennis courts. It is particularly worrying that the perpetrators are smashing glass bottles on the tennis courts – this could result in serious injuries to children/adults (thank you to residents who have taken it upon themselves to clear up the glass to prevent injuries to others). We would like to emphasise that it is not acceptable behaviour to be drinking alcohol in the children's playground/tennis courts.

#### **Neighbourhood Development Plan**

Work is ongoing with Bishops Itchington developing a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP).

## Bishop's Itchington Parish Council

What is a neighbourhood planning: Neighbourhood planning was introduced in the Localism Act of 2011. Neighbourhood planning is not a legal requirement, but a right that communities within England can choose to use – Bishops Itchington has chosen to do so. A 'NDP' establishes a vision and planning policies for its area, as well as proposals for the future development and land use. The plan will be a significant consideration when Stratford District Council makes decisions on planning applications that fall within the plan's geographic area. Neighbourhood planning enables communities to play a much stronger role in shaping the areas in which they live and work and in supporting new development proposals. This is because unlike the parish, village or town plans that communities may have prepared, a neighbourhood plan forms part of the development plan and sits alongside the Local Plan prepared by the local planning authority. Decisions on planning applications will be made using both the local plan and the Neighbourhood Plan, and any other material considerations.

Where are we now: Some of you will remember the village, survey conducted back in 2016 – this formed the basis of a draft Plan which has subsequently been presented to Stratford District Council for review. Part of the regulatory process with developing a NDP is that everyone living or working within the designated area must be consulted on the Plan and we are now at this stage - it has been passed for the pre-submission consultation, Regulation 14 stage. A copy of the Plan for you to review can be found on the Parish Council website – select "The Parish Council" tab, then click on the "Neighbourhood Plan" tab - a copy of the Plan can be found here. If you do not have internet access and you wish to see a copy, please phone the Parish Clerk on 07450360453 and request a hard copy – we will deliver one to you. If you have any comments or questions, there is also a "Comments Form" on the website – please use this to correspond. The PC will not be responding to questions individually as and when they are raised - all comments will be collated and followed up at the end of the consultation. Similarly, please request a hard copy Comments Form if required.

#### Our what?

A Neighbourhood Plan documents your views and sits alongside Stratford DC's Core Strategy when it comes to deciding planning applications. It can influence the type, scale and location of development within the parish.

#### OK, so what have you done so far?

Some of you will remember the village survey conducted back in 2016. We have used the results and, working with a planning consultant, we have produced policies and created a draft plan. The good news is that this has just been reviewed by Stratford DC and has passed its 'health check'.

#### Great. What next?

We are now ready to ask what you think, in what is known as a 'Regulation 14 consultation'. Copies of the plan will be available (online and in print) and you will be able to send your feedback comments. These will all be reviewed and considered for the final version. We will also run some information sessions (within the COVID-19 rules in place at the time). Please do try to come along.

#### The public consultation will run for 8 weeks from 1st February 2021.

Monthly Meeting held in The Memorial Hall, June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1937. Mrs Jeffrey in the Chair. 20 Members present. County Secretary's letter read. Report of last meeting read and confirmed. A letter was read from the Matron of the Home for Incurables thanking the WI for the gift of eggs. A letter was read from Mrs Pluvus\*, Group Convenor, and in response to her invitation it was decided to try and enter a team in the Folk Dancing display at Guys Cliffe on July 21<sup>st</sup> at the Group Garden Party. #### WALK NO. 1 OF AN OCCASIONAL SERIES

This walk is over well used paths towards Harbury. It is level once you have left the village and is about 4 miles in length. The recommended map is OS Explorer no. 206.

- S. Starting at Mount Pleasant go up the path to the left of No. 1
- 1. Go straight up the field through the gap and over a stile
- **2**. Go diagonally right towards some poplar trees. After the trees continue walking with the hedge on your left. Cut diagonally right towards a farm track and a stile.
- Go over the stile and down the field over a ditch to a double stile on the right
- 4. Turn left and follow the hedge to the lane
- Go straight across through a gate and straight on through to two more gates
- 6. Turn left along the hedge in front
- **7.** Turn right in the corner and through a gate into the Harbury Playing field
- 8. Follow the path to the left to a track on the left in the far corner
- 9. Go across an arable field to Bush Heath Lane
- 10. Turn right and then left after about 100 yards straight onto Warwick Road. Turn right along the road for about 100 yards then through a gate and sharp left and along the hedge through two gates to exit left onto the Estate road
- Turn right and walk for about 50 yards then turn left onto a bridle way

(our Parish boundary almost to the motorway)

- 12. Continue for almost 1/2 mile to a metal gate on the left
- **13.** Go slightly right across the field to a track to the right of the solar farm opposite
- 14. Go along the track past the allotments on the right and out onto Plough Lane
- 15. Turn right down the lane for about 300 yards
- 16. Take the steps up the bank on the left which take you across a field to a

stile into Manor Road FINISH
