#### ST MICHAEL'S NEWS



#### A lot can happen in a week

Easter explores once more that amazing 8 days that changed the world. A gifted, Godly teacher and healer arrives in Jerusalem. He has spent three years telling people about God's kingdom and showing people what it looked like. People were healed, set free from spiritual and mental illnesses, restored to communities and relationships, given a new start ...

His popularity posed a threat to the authorities, and his teaching challenged their understanding and traditions surrounding faith in God. And so, by the end of the week, they had him arrested, sentenced to death on false charges, and crucified.

They thought that would be the end of it. But they weren't sure ... even placing guards at his tomb.

So imagine their surprise when that Sunday morning, rumours that he was alive began to circulate .. the story spreading like wildfire as more and more people saw him, spent time with him, ate with him. Not a teacher but the Son, the Saviour .. risen.

That story gave hope, gives hope, and continues to transform people today. I had the privilege of visiting a lovely lady who over a period of a week slipped away ... her last words to me were "I wish Jesus would take me in his arms" ..I reassured her that he would and a couple of days later she fell asleep .. Her relationship with Jesus simply shone out of her and shaped her whole life, so even as she was dying, she was more concerned for her grandson who'd had some bad news, wanting to pray for him ...

A lot can happen in a week ... we see fears and anxiety spread, we see a moment of God breaking through the darkness of our world, and the reality of that in people's lives and experience.

What will your week bring? In the Easter story, there is life and hope .. and in the end, His peace falls.

#### ST MICHAEL'S NEWS

The Bishop of St Albans Coronavirus Golden Rules

Not official advice: read and heed that – but this is food-for-thought
about our attitudes.

**Golden Rule One:** Each one of us can think about how we can protect and support our neighbours. So much of the public rhetoric is sowing fear about the danger of other people. So, taking all the official precautions, offer help and reassurance to others – and don't demonise anyone or any group.

**Golden Rule Two**: Think about who may be suffering more than me. For those of us who are healthy there is much less to worry about but the elderly, the housebound and those with chronic health conditions may be very anxious. How about phoning any vulnerable people we know. There's nothing like a friendly voice to offer solace when someone is worried. A smile can bring cheer, even on the phone. If you visit, follow all the official precautions or don't go.

**Golden Rule Three:** Don't give in to panic and start hoarding food. There is plenty to go around, so practise the Christian discipline of sharing. Ask your neighbours what they need and do your best to help them get it. If you are self-isolating you will of course need some supplies.

**Golden Rule Four:** Live today to the full. None of us ever know what the future holds. In the Sermon on the Mount (Matt 6.25–34), Jesus challenged his followers to live each day fully and not be afraid. Every time we are tempted to give in to fear we need to make a conscious choice to respond in trust and openness.

And, along with just over half the adults in the UK, don't forget to pray. Here's a suggestion :

Dear God our Shield and our Defender, guide and protect my neighbour in this time of health emergency; deliver them from all harm and may your love and care ever grow in this place. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord, Amen.



## Friends of the Yellow Land & BING

First of all, thank you to the Scene editors for the great new "logo" that went with last month's article. It's great!



We have finished scrub clearance on the Yellow Land for the winter. The bird nesting season is fast approaching and so it's not a good idea to disturb them. #### A WALK AROUND THE CEMETERY -LUCY EMILY FINCH

When walking towards the Cemetery Chapel, turn right three rows before Chapel and near the end of the row you will find the last resting place of Lucy Emily and Percy Finch.

Lucy's maiden name was Freeman and she was born in Bishops Itchington on 27<sup>th</sup> May 1898. Her parents were Walter and Beatrice (nee Holtham). The family lived in Elestree Cottages, Hambridge Road; they later moved to Co-op Terrace, living in one of the four cottages situated before the Co-op as you walk down Chapel Street.

Lucy's sibling were Richard born 1892, John born 1900, Arthur born 1902 and Edith born 1904, all in Bishops Itchington.

Walter and Beatrice decided to move to Hebburn in 1908, afterwards more children came; Nellie in 1909, Beatrice in 1910, Emily in 1912 and William in 1913. Arthur, Beatrice and Emily died very young. In 1911 the family lived at 30 Buchanan Street, Hebburn New Town, County Durham.

Owing to some of Beatrice's family moving to Hebburn, County Durham for work, some of the village families also moved to Durham. Men could not find work within the Southam area, many men from around British Isles moved to Hebburn area, owing to its growth in Tyneside; work was available in making bricks, metals, chemical work and fishing. Later the North was hit hard with the 1930 depression.

In WWI Percy Finch joined the army. One day Lucy was standing on the quay side of the docks of the River Tyne (the Quayside held a market there) when she saw Percy getting ready to board a ship. They wrote to each other and in September 1920 married in Aston Birmingham. Their first child John was born on 9<sup>th</sup> October 1922 in Birmingham. After moving to Warwick Edith was born on 2<sup>nd</sup> January 1924 and Hylda was born on 15th July 1925.

In 1925 the family moved back to the village of their birth, moving into one of the six cottages (Cross Green) which stood on the land where the Cross Green Flats are now. Friends also lived there or later moved in to the five houses; the Holloways, Majors, Sheasbys and Smith families. Lucy and Percy had triplets on 12<sup>th</sup> October 1926, Eudine, Georgina and Nellie, named after her sister Nellie from Hebburn. Nellie visited and stayed to help with the other children. To have 6 children under the age of 5 must have been very hard work, no washing machine, tumble dryer etc., just a wash tub in the yard. The third triplet Nellie died within a few weeks of her birth; I believe they are the only triplets born in Bishops Itchington.

Lady Lakin visited after the birth, giving gifts of 3 knitted shawls for the 3 girls. When Nellie passed away, Lucy wrapped her in her shawl; when a friend told her to keep the shawl for the other children her remark was 'It is Nellie's, so she will be buried in it.' Nellie is buried on the left-hand side of the path by Mary Ann Mann who was Lucy's great aunt. The last child of the family was Percy born 17<sup>th</sup> March 1930.

When WWII broke out Lucy had three members of her family fighting for Queen and Country, John and Percy plus her husband Percy. He joined the Navy. Not many families can say that a member fought in both wars. Percy went out one day and signed up to serve. Lucy did not know and when she found out, she was so worried by the thought of not much money being bought into the home, she wrote to the War Office asking for him to be sent home. Her reply came by letter which informed her that Percy had signed up as a volunteer, therefore, he would be staying. Not the answer Lucy wanted.

In 1948 council houses had been built for the returning families who had children, Lucy and Percy were given 23 Manor Road.

To move into a large home, instead of the small cottage they had been living in must have been welcomed, but I expect they missed their friends left in Cross Green. The children married with Eudine and Georgina marrying brothers and moving to live in Kent, John never married. Edith married a soldier David Porter, he was sent to Pipers Hill, which had been transformed to a war hospital, after being injured, Hylda married Walter Bloxham from Harbury. After their first child was born they emigrated to Canada on 3<sup>rd</sup> June 1953, Hylda returned to have the rest of her children baptised at the village church.

After moving to Manor Road Lucy had spare time of her hands. She was one of the main fundraisers for a woman's branch of the Royal British Legion, later becoming president. Lucy bought a picture of our Queen to hang in the clubhouse and when it closed the committee at Memorial Hall allowed this picture to be hung on the wall. She joined the Mothers' Union at the Church and the family were always at the services on Sunday. Later in life, she attended church at 8am on Wednesday for Communion.

Lucy led a full life. As a school girl she moved to Tyneside, having to learn a different dialect; she moved back to live in Warwick, finally returning home. She had a good husband in Percy, and good children, but losing Nellie and then Hylda moving to Canada must have been a troubled time in her life.

Lucy became Chairlady of the Mothers Union, Lady Lakin (then Sybil) used to invite the Union for afternoon tea. In 1960/70 she was determined for the village to have a branch clubhouse of the Royal British Legion, she became a very active President.

Hylda returned home as often as she could. The 10 grandchildren (4 in Kent and 6 in Canada) were her life. Lucy died on 7<sup>th</sup> July 1987.

Many will remember Lucy Finch, she was a strong lady, called a spade a spade, and loved by many...
