



Sadly Doreen Rutter (aged 91) died at Galanos House on 16<sup>th</sup> April. She lived in Bishops Itchington for many years and people will remember her as the school cook and as a 'granny' to lots of small children at Busy Bees Playgroup when she came to visit and read stories



At the beginning of March about a dozen of us boarded a Catteralls coach for a day trip to Bridgnorth and Ludlow. Bridgnorth Upper town was explored first but we didn't venture on to the Lower town via the funicular. After lunch we walked round Malvern and took tea there. It was a lovely day out.

And now because of Corona virus and the national lockdown we haven't (quite rightly) done a thing. But we are all, WI members or not, in the same boat having had all future plans cancelled for the foreseeable future. Because many of our members fall into the official "vulnerable" category all we can do is keep ourselves safe and keep in contact with others to help if needed and to keep spirits up.

And now for something <del>completely</del> slightly different. Before the lockdown I hadn't managed to investigate further the whereabouts of our WI Minutes from our foundation in 1925. (The handwriting is rather ornamented and not easy to read, so I may have made errors in the spelling of some names.)

Monthly Meeting held in The Memorial Hall, June 4<sup>th</sup> 1936 Mrs Jeffrey in the Chair.

13 Members present.

Apologies for absence from Miss Davies, Mrs W. Jenkins & Mrs Wall. Two new Members were elected to Membership, Mrs A. Barnett & Mrs E. Robbins. A letter was read from the Matron of the Home for Incurables thanking the WI for the gift of eggs. The

President gave a short report of her visit to the Annual Meeting in London. A letter was read from Miss Beves asking if Bishops Itchington would assist with the selling of programmes at Combe (sic) Abbey instead of the Anti Litter stall.

Tiley of Kineton to whom a very hearty vote of thanks was accorded. During the tea interval a draw for a 'CrossStitch Rug' took place, the winner being Mrs Cyril Payne, the proceeds resulting in 16s 9p for WI funds. A short Whist Drive brought a very pleasant evening to a close, the winners being Mrs Cummings, Mrs Bean & Miss Bulter.

Miss Palmer judged the entries for home-grown flowers and awarded the prize to Mrs Ball. The flowers were afterwards left in the Hall for the decoration of the tables of the Church Army Crusaders who were visiting the village at the weekend.

After refreshments a short Whist Drive was decided on instead of games, the winners being Mrs E. Robbins, Mrs P. Cummings & Mrs W. Jenkins.



### A WALK AROUND THE CEMETERY : ANN BEASLEY

On entering the Cemetery walk to the start of the Chapel, turn left and four graves in is the last resting place of Ann Beasley. Ann was born into the Robbins family. Her father John Robbins was the local shoe repairer and the family lived in Shoe Maker Cottage. Ann was born in 1849. Her siblings were William born 1845, Jane born 1847, Joseph born 1858 and Henry born 1860. The family were all born in Bishops Itchington.

On 26<sup>th</sup> November 1876 Ann married Charles Beasley at the village Church. The Beasley family lived in a Cement works cottage in Chapel Street known as Co-op Terrace, they are only two bedroom cottages. Charles father, William, lost his wife early in life leaving him to look after the children of the marriage, Charles, Sarah and Mary. His brother John also lived at the house, so like many families room would have been tight. After Charles and Ann married, they also lived in one of the Co-op Terrace cottages. A family soon followed namely Mildred Jane born 1878, Alice born 1880, Annie born 1882, Egbert Charles born 1885, John William born 1887 and Harry born 1890. Alice was an unwell baby and later classed as 'feeble-minded'. She and Annie were never apart, to the point that Annie never married. She was happy to look after and care for Alice.

By the 1890s the Beasley family had moved to Fern Cottage in Gaydon Road just past Chapple Avenue, having three bedrooms and a large garden it must have been a dream come true.

Ann's husband passed away aged 57 years in 1901 leaving Ann to look after their family. She must have had a hard time but with both sides of the family living in the village, they would make sure food was on the table. The cottage in Gaydon Road had a very large garden, with ample fruit trees, which Ann sold to make some money. Even when Harry was alone in the cottage he still sold or gave away the fruit.

John emigrated to Canada on 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1911, serving in WWI with the Canadian Infantry and was killed on the Somme. His wife, Emily, and their three children were left in Canada to start a new life without him.

### A WALK AROUND THE CEMETERY : ANN BEASLEY

Egbert who married Georgina Ellis emigrated to Canada from Liverpool on 12<sup>th</sup> April 1912 and he died in Toronto in 1966. Mildred never married, she was a servant and her last job was at 28 Charlotte Street, Leamington Spa. She moved back to the village living at 3 Poplar Terrace until she passed away on 22<sup>nd</sup> October 1931 leaving her effects of £172 to Annie.

Ann settled in Fern Cottage with the three children who never married, Alice, Annie and Harry, with Annie taking care of Alice. Harry was working, Ann did needlework for others plus jam making from fruit and vegetables from the garden, the fruit that had fallen off the trees were put outside the gate for anyone to take.

Ann was admitted to Warneford Hospital in Learnington in 1931, she came home and passed away February 1931.

Throughout her life, she had lost one son in WWI, another emigrated to Canada, Mildred was in the village. Ann left the other three living at Fern Cottage. Just before WWII Emily, John's wife, did visit the family returning to Canada in 1939. Egbert's and his wife Georgina's last visit to see Harry was in August 1955. Alice passed away January 1955 soon followed by Annie in February 1955. They spent less than 5 weeks without each other for the whole of their lives. Harry lived alone until his death in 1965.

If you look at any village family tree, it is likely that you will find a member of the Beasley family within it. Their history goes back to 17c and not many moved from the village. Many of their extended family are still living in the village, namely relations of Hunt, Knight, Taylor, Eden and Wilson families. alsters kelley solicitars






