#### A WALK AROUND THE CEMETERY: Oliver Mark Gutteridge

On entering the Cemetery, walk to the start of the Chapel building and take the second row before the Chapel and you will find the resting place of Oliver Mark Gutteridge and his wife Beatrice Ellen. Oliver was born 12<sup>th</sup> October 1883 in Crays Pond, Goring-on-Thames, South Oxfordshire. His parents were his father, Joseph, (born 1842) from Whitchurch-on-Thames, Oxfordshire and his mother, Jane nee Lipscombe, born 1845 at Goring-on-Thames. The family settled in Crays Pond, they lived in the same hamlet for many years. Oliver's siblings were John born 1864, Charles Francis 1868, Clara Jane 1869, Albert 1871, Thomas William 1873, Charlotte 1875, Joseph born 1878 and Blanche 1882.

Oliver's father was a carpenter, then changed his profession to work for a miller. This could have been the opening for Oliver when he finished school to become a miller's labourer, working his way up to be a baker. Oliver married Beatrice Ellen Bush, born 20<sup>th</sup> January 1885, in Crays Pond on 13<sup>th</sup> March 1907. Her father owned the White Lion at Crays Pond, so the wedding reception was probably held in the pub. On marriage Oliver and Beatrice moved to live in Oxenwood nr Hungerford Berkshire. At this time Oliver was a baker.

Two girls arrived to make the family complete, Dorothy Evelyn, born 13<sup>th</sup> August 1907 and Gladys Mable born 16<sup>th</sup> March 1909, both being born in Oxenwood. When the girls were small Oliver gained employment with the Harbury Co-operative Society at their No 1 Branch in Bishops Itchington. The Harbury Co-operative Industrial and Provident Society was formed about 1863 by the Bustin brothers, working for the railway they opened the shop in the evening after a hard day at work. It was one of the first independent societies formed in Warwickshire.

The appeal for the Co-op movement to the poor people were the shares on purchases, therefore, while buying items they accumulated shares which were paid into their savings bank. In 1878 it acquired a shop in Bishops Itchington and named it the No 1 Branch. Harbury and Bishops Itchington Co-op remained independent until the1970s when it was taken over by Rugby Co-op Society.

#### A WALK AROUND THE CEMETERY: Oliver Mark Gutteridge

No 1 Branch in Bishops Itchington was attached to Harbury Co-operative Society. One wonders how Oliver heard of the job. Why move so far for employment. When Oliver and his family moved into the village, they lived in the house adjoining the store. He came as the branch manager, at this time the shop was self-contained and sold everything required by the wife and her family. Upstairs (which is now a flat), was home to a drapery, all items for the home, plus wool, dresses, trousers, jackets even waistcoats which every man wore at the start of 20<sup>th</sup> century. If you required an item which they had not got, it would be sent over from Harbury headquarters the next day. Downstairs in the main food shop most items were sold by weight from larger sacks, flours, sugar etc., nothing was prepacked like today, everything was weighed or counted out. Oliver being a baker had the bakehouse at the back of the shop. Also pigs were kept and when killed used in the shop for bacon and joints, sometimes householder's joints and fowl for Christmas were cooked in the baker's ovens which you could use for a few pence.

Dorothy and Gladys attended the local village school. At the age of 14, Dorothy stayed at the school as a pupil teacher. This may have been because lady teachers from the school lodged with the Gutteridge family.

One was Miss Clark who the girls thought was far too strict plus she informed their parents if they had not done their schoolwork well. After Miss Clark left the school she was replaced by Miss Rowbotham, the two girls liked her and this may have been the reason why Dorothy became a pupil teacher.

WWI came and recruitment drives were held in towns and villages. By 1916 conscription came and on 5<sup>th</sup> June 1918 Oliver joined the Royal Air Force (RAF). This was formed early in 1918 by joining the Royal Flying Corps (RFC) and Royal Naval Air Service (RNAS) together. Conscription finished on 11<sup>th</sup> November 1918 and most of the conscripts were discharged.

#### WALK AROUND THE CEMETERY : Oliver Mark Gutteridge

Oliver's daughter Dorothy married Leonard Charles Rawbone at the Church of Our Lady and St Wulstan in Southam, in 1931. Dorothy died in 1933 at Southam. They had one son Anthony who died aged 18 in 1950, must have been a sad time for the Gutteridge family to lose their eldest daughter, so soon after marriage, and then in 1950 the only grandchild they had. The youngest daughter Gladys never married and stayed at home to care for her parents. Oliver and family attended St Michael's Church, he was a sidesman and Oliver and Beatrice were caretakers. The family were continually active within the village, Oliver liked a game of whist, played cricket and helped with the Poppy Appeal, he also gave service in WWII in Civil Defence Corps (Dads Army).

Owing to living in a tied house, Oliver started to look for a house to live in after retirement. The house they bought was just up the road from the Co-op, Laurel Cottage. The family stayed at Laurel Cottage for the rest of their lives. Oliver was buried in local cemetery on 14<sup>th</sup> March 1968, his wife Beatrice Ellen followed on 23<sup>rd</sup> August 1968. Their daughter Gladys stayed in the house until she passed away on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2004. Gladys is buried at the foot of her parents.

The Gutteridge family were very well known and respected in the village.

#### Census 2021 'Be Scam Aware'

Census Day is Sunday 21 March 2021. After Census Day, at the end of March and into April, census field officers will be visiting households from which they have not received a completed census form. They will encourage people to complete the census and help residents to access further help if they need it. Scammers may seek to use the Census as an opportunity to perpetrate doorstep, telephone, and online scams, so it is important to remember the following:

- At no point will you be asked for your national insurance number, passwords, bank account details, or your credit or debit card numbers, nor any payment
- You will not receive any payment for completing the census, so any offers of money in exchange for your account details will be fraudulent
- You will not be called for information about the census unless you've made an appointment with the Census Contact Centre or made a query or complaint
- No-one will enter your home in relation to the census

- You can report a fraud direct to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or visit: https://www.actionfraud.police.uk/

Warwickshire homeowners have reported receiving nuisance phone calls from people informing them that someone will visit their property to check for damp. The callers were also asking about the resident's financial situation. Offering free surveys is sometimes a way for unscrupulous businesses to access people's properties so they can apply the 'hard sell' and carry out often very expensive and unnecessary insulation work. Put the phone down immediately on cold callers and never buy goods or services from unexpected callers, either on the doorstep or over the phone. #### Top Tips to Buy a Puppy Safely

- Buy from a reputable and recommended dealer. Consider the Kennel Club Assured breeder scheme
- 2. Always view the puppy with its mother and siblings, where it has been bred
- 3. Ask to see the health test certificates for the puppy's parents and the puppy's vaccination documentation
- 4. Be prepared to wait for the puppy you want. Be very wary of anyone claiming they can provide the puppy you want quickly
- 5. Many bogus breeders 'sell' puppies on social media where money is taken for large deposits, but no puppy is ever delivered. If you're asked to pay a deposit, check to ensure the seller is genuine first.
- 6. Never agree to meet the seller anywhere other than where the puppy is kept, for example car parks, motorway service stations etc. Do not allow the seller to deliver the puppy to your home
- 7. Beware of anyone offering a puppy at a 'too good to be true' price
- 8. To report puppy scams, the illegal sale of puppies and obtain advice on your consumer rights, contact the Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 0808 223 1133

## Don't pay criminals for stolen puppies, sick puppies and puppies that don't even exist!

Consumers are paying thousands to criminals for stolen and sick puppies and in some case puppies that don't even exist, **Warwickshire County Council's Trading Standards Service** is warning.

## Warwickshire County Councillor Andy Crump, Portfolio Holder for Community Safety said:

"The popularity of owning a dog has increased since the pandemic began, such that demand for puppies has gone through the roof and prices for many breeds have more than doubled."

"Unfortunately, this has encouraged criminals to get involved, leading to more puppy thefts and prospective owners paying huge sums for stolen or sick puppies or large deposits for puppies that don't even exist."

"We've published some top tips to assist would be dog owners to avoid these scam puppy sales."

Trading Standards Animal Health Officers have received reports of criminal gangs illegally smuggling puppies in to the UK to sell, puppies being stolen and sold on and consumers paying huge deposits to online sellers for puppies that don't exist.

Illegally imported puppies may carry diseases that are a threat to human health such as rabies. Criminal gangs have also been involved in puppy farming, where dogs are often bred in appalling conditions, increasing the risk of disease and ill health.

In April 2020 'Lucy's Law' was introduced, meaning that anyone wanting to get a new puppy (or kitten) in England must now buy direct from a breeder, or consider adopting from a rescue centre instead. Licensed dog breeders are required to show puppies interacting with their mothers in their place of birth. If a business sells puppies (or kittens) without a licence, they could receive an unlimited fine or be sent to prison for up to six months. The new law seeks to tackle the low-welfare, high volume supply of puppies (and kittens), by banning their commercial third-party sale in England.
