And finally, Bishop's Itchington Parish Council wishes all our residents a happy Christmas and a peaceful New Year.



As we look back on our year, 2020 will be one of the more memorable probably for all the wrong reasons. Mainly the



consequences of this awful pandemic which has caused so much hardship and suffering to so many people.

Scouting both here in the village and nationally has been particularly hard hit. Cancelled camps, both for those which should have taken place this year and also those planned for 2021. In effect our young people have lost almost a year of their Scouting lives - time that can never be regained.

When the initial lockdown arrived in March Scouting was put on Stage Red which meant we could no longer meet face to face. At that time we began to hold virtual meetings which, although not really supported by all sections, was quite successful and enjoyed by our Cub section and I congratulate Edd and his leader team for ensuring that our young people still had access to Scouting.

At the end of this first lockdown we were moved to a Stage Amber which allowed us to hold number limited face to face meetings outdoors. Again the Cubs embraced this limited freedom and several meetings were held involving Fire Lighting, Cooking and Hiking etc.

As we now find ourselves in this second lockdown and move back to a Stage Red this means that this year Scouts cannot operate our now traditional Christmas Postal Service and we cannot also hold our Christmas Carol Service. Hopefully we will be back to a 'New Normal' in 2021.

Looking forward to the New Year when hopefully we will be allowed to resume face to face meetings with our young people as a group we have new challenges to face. For our Beaver Section to begin to meet again we have to recruit new Leaders and Adult Volunteers.



At this time we only have Graham leading our Beaver Colony. To comply with strict safeguarding rules we have to have a minimum of one leader per six children to meet safety ratios. Is your child already a member of Beavers? Would your child like to become a member? Would you or someone you know be willing to volunteer as a regular leader? Are there any 18 + young people out there who would like to volunteer? Being a Scout Leader can be really rewarding and your appointment looks great on your CV. The time commitment is small -1-1.5hours per week plus possibly extra time for planning meetings and events. You don't need experience as full training is freely available. Without your help Beavers will not be able to restart so please contact either Graham or myself if you are interested in volunteering. We are always keen to welcome more adults into all of our sections and in particular our Scout Section which caters for the 10.5 – 14 year olds.

When we are finally allowed to resume activities which hopefully will be early in the new year we will have spaces in all

of our sections; Beavers – Ages 6 – 7.5 years

Cubs - Ages 7.5 – 10.5 years Scouts - Ages 10.5 – 14 years.

If you are tired of being confined to home or fed up with computer games, come out and have fun with Scouting in all our sections (Grown-ups included). We have a great leader team and a great fun programme of activities ready for you to enjoy.





Email Account Takeover Scam



Email account takeover occurs when a fraudster gains access to a legitimate user's email account. They may do so by obtaining passwords and usernames from the dark web or via phishing scams. When this happens, fraudsters can send emails (posing as the legitimate user) to the users' friends and family in their email address book. These emails can appear very genuine because the fraudster can word them in the same way as the legitimate user would do.

This is a typical case: a person receives an email they believe is genuine (but has in fact been sent by a fraudster) asking them to purchase some gift cards on behalf of the email sender, as gifts for a relative. The email's recipient does so and is then asked to send the card numbers to the email sender (the fraudster). Fraudsters don't need to the physical cards to use them, only the card numbers.

Your email account is arguably the most vital online account you possess. Cyber criminals can use your email to access many of your personal accounts, leaving you vulnerable to identity theft.
