

The parish council has continued to hold its monthly business meetings throughout the lockdown period. We have done this by meeting remotely via Zoom. Hard Courts

Those of you who use the hard courts throughout the year, will be pleased to know that the current floodlights are to be replaced with LEDs. A few of them haven't been working for some time and now the parish council has decided to replace all of them with new LEDs which will be much more energy efficient.

Cemetery Water Supply

There was a problem a few weeks ago when the water butt ran dry as a result of the long dry spell in April and May. We have re-filled the water butt and put some more water in the large tank as well. Please note that the tap on the large tank is liable to drip. Please make sure you turn it off properly. There is signage in place to explain how to do this. The parish council recognises that as our climate changes, there are likely to be more problems with water shortages in the future. The council has set up a working party to explore possible solutions. In the meantime, we will continue to monitor the water supply and top it up again if required.

Neighbourhood Development Plan

A small but dedicated group has continued to work on the NDP and has produced a draft policy document. We have now appointed a planning consultant to complete the preparation of the plan and take it forward to formal adoption by SDC as a local planning policy. There are still several stages to go through, including a formal public consultation, examination by a planning inspector and a referendum in which the community will be asked to vote on whether to approve the plan or not.

Pavilion Project

The working party has been meeting via Zoom over the last few weeks and quite a lot of progress has been made. At the time of writing, we are seeking an architect to draw up detailed plans and re-apply for planning permission. Anyone who would like to be involved is encouraged to get in touch with us.

INSPIRING WOMEN REPORT

We've had a Committee Meeting, via Zoom, but obviously, because any lockdown easing will be gradual we can't yet plan any activities or resume our monthly meetings. The only thing that I can report is that refunds for all the cancelled Federation events are being issued. And the only event that was postponed, i.e. the Annual Fed. Meeting, has now also been cancelled, meaning even more refunds. Please be patient as the Fed Treasurer and our Treasurer, Sandra, have a lot to deal with. However we have a date for the next Annual Fed Meeting – 28 April 2021. Let's hope that by then things will be fairly back to normal.

Because the National Annual Meeting in the Royal Albert Hall in London had to be cancelled the two highest scoring Resolutions in the earlier vote have now been adopted and we can now start campaigning on them. The two Resolutions are regarding the Stem Cell Register, and Ending Modern Slavery. In addition, we have been asked for suggestions for possible Resolutions for 2021. Guidance is available online.

And now for the next instalment of our long running serial "Minutes of Bishops Itchington's Women's Institute 1936". When I say "long running" I mean it – we've got over another 90 years' worth to get through until we resume our own meetings!

"12th Annual Meeting, Nov 5th 1936.

At 5.30 twenty seven members sat down to a very enjoyable tea provided by the Catering Sub-Committee under the **leadership of Mrs Wall. After tea Mrs Jeffrey took the "Chair"** and the usual business proceeded. The Secretary read the Annual Report of 1935 and report of the Oct monthly meeting. The names of the new Committee were read* and Mrs Jeffrey was unanimously re-elected President.



Miss Davies who unfortunately was unable to attend was reelected Vice-President. Secretary then read the Annual Report and Treasurer followed with a very satisfactory Financial Statement. Sub-Committee reports were read by Mrs Wall and Mrs W. Jenkins, and Mrs Thacker submitted a very good account of the Annual Meeting at Warwick. Mrs Thacker also reported a loss on Home & Country.

A short Address from the President then followed. A list of suggestions for the 1937 Programme was approved by the members and suggestions for games and competitions was (sic) appealed for the social half hour.

After the business the prizes for the best articles made from one yard of material or four ounces of wool were awarded as follows: Sewing, 1st Mrs W. Jenkins, 2nd Mrs B. Jenkins; Knitting, 1st Miss Hartshorne, 2nd Mrs Ball.

A very enjoyable concert followed, given by the Dramatic Section of the Southam Women's Institute who gave a splendid programme and to whom a very hearty vote of thanks was accorded. As each member of the WI was permitted to invite two friends there was a very good audience present. 3d each was paid for admission by each visitor and the sum of 6s 9d was put to Institute funds after expenses were paid.



A WALK AROUND THE CEMETERY

JOHN FORREST SUTCLIFFE : LRCP, LRCS EDINBOUGH LRFPS GLASOW 1894


As you walk through the gates of the Cemetery after the Lakin memorial, you will see on the left hand side a Sutcliffe family grave, which is a double grave but also takes up two rows making it the largest grave in Cemetery. Only John and his wife Minnie were buried within this plot, so I believe this ground was bought for further members of the Sutcliffe family to use. John Forrest Sutcliffe was born in Lowtown, Kildare Ireland on 15th August 1873. His parents were George Frances born in 1827 and Mary (nee Perry) born in 1846, both born in Ireland. The family were Protestant Episcopal Church of Ireland. Siblings to John were James born 1868, George Perry 1869, Charles William 1971, Susan Hannah Caroline 1874, Mary Sarah Alicia 1876, Gilbert George 1880, Elizabeth Porter 1881, William Henry 1884, Robert Alexander 1887, Rupert Smith 1889. Susan, Mary and Gilbert died when young.

After being schooled in Kildare, John attended Edinburgh and Glasgow Universities, gaining his qualifications of LRCP/LRCS from Edinburgh and LRFPS from Glasgow in 1894. John moved to live in Harbury after becoming a physician and surgeon, living at 10 Mill Street. On 3rd April 1907 John married, in Dublin, to Minnie Moulang born 7th January 1881. The Moulangs were Huguenot refugees who came to Dublin between 1681 to 1685. The couple moved to Victoria House, Farm Street, Harbury. Once settled into life in Harbury, their children were born, first a boy named after his father on 17th February 1908, Aileen Mary on 20th July 1909, and Olive 11th December 1911. The children were baptised in All Saints Church, Harbury.

The children followed their father into the medical profession. John working with his father's practice in Harbury and surrounding villages, Aileen working at Coventry and Warwickshire Hospital as a casualty doctor then moving to work in London. Olive became a doctor of midwifery. Alice Daisy Padbury from Kingston aged 16 years worked for the family. John often returned to Ireland owing to his love of horse racing, which was later followed by his son.

John's surgery in Harbury was within his home (Victoria House). The surgery was to the south of the building with a very small waiting room and small doctor's room. In Bishops Itchington the surgery was in the Post Office which Mr Gibbs ran just off the main road. When this was closed and moved into Poplar Road, John Jnr moved the practice to a wooden type building by the Malt Shovel Public House (it was surrounded by allotments) situated on Dark Road which is now Fisher Road. At the time of John's service, his son John Forrest Jnr. worked with him. Dr James Pirie was also working to help the sick, he had a surgery next to 'The Cell' on Gaydon Road. After WWII, Dr Horace Allott became a doctor to the villages, he held his surgery in the small room at Memorial Hall.

John Forrest Jnr. retired in the late 1960s and moved to Ireland returning later to live in Suffolk. A new surgery was built when 'Sutcliffe Pastures' housing development was built in Harbury.

At around the same time The Mansions were pulled down to build Mansion Close and, at the same time, the village had a new surgery in Fisher Road.

Until 5th July 1948, people had to pay to see a doctor, go into hospital, have a baby, the list is endless.

This date was an historic moment in the British history, the dream of Aneurin 'Nye' Bevan was to bring all health services under one banner NHS, John Sutcliffe knew we were poor villagers and often the fee for medical assistance was not asked for from the poor, the better off joined clubs which paid the doctor. The gentry would often pay for their workers, all this finished on 5th July 1948.

John Forrest Sutcliffe's died in Warneford Hospital, Radford Road, Leamington Spa on 27th March 1943. On his memorial are the words 'By Words a Man is Justified'.



RHUBARB CRUMBLE LOAF CAKE

Ingredients

For the crumble topping 15g (½ oz) butter, chilled and cut into cubes 25g (2 oz) self-raising flour 15g (½ oz) demerara sugar

For the cake 100g (3½ oz) butter at room temperature 200g (7 oz) caster sugar 3 medium eggs, lightly beaten 100g (3½ oz) sour cream 1tsp vanilla extract 200g (7 oz) self-raising flour 225 (8 oz) rhubarb trimmed and cut into 5mm (¼ inch) slices



Preheat the oven to 180 °C (160° C fan), gas mark 4 and line a 900g (2 lb) loaf tin with baking parchment, making it a little taller than the sides of the tin.

For crumble topping

Put cold butter and flour into a bowl, rub together with fingertips until like breadcrumbs. Stir in sugar and set to one side.

To make cake

Put softened butter into a separate bowl with sugar, beat together until pale and fluffy. Gradually beat into eggs, then sour cream and vanilla. Use a metal spoon to fold in flour and two thirds of the rhubarb. Spoon mixture into prepared tin, scatter over remaining rhubarb then sprinkle with the crumble mixture. Bake for 1hr 15 mins or until golden and a skewer pushed into the centre comes out clean.

'Nottingham Knockers' Warning

Warwickshire Trading Standards has received reports from Warwickshire Police that groups of so called 'Nottingham Knockers' have been operating in the Nuneaton and Bedworth area in the past few days. These doorstep callers



offer small household products for sale which may be of poor quality, at inflated prices, and pressure homeowners in to buying by falsely claiming to be ex-convicts on probation schemes.

Door to Door Mattress Seller Warning

Warwickshire residents are being targeted by door to door mattress sellers. The sellers often employ high pressure sales techniques to encourage a sale and may claim the products are surplus stock from new development show homes or that they are top of the range products, whilst in reality they may be cheap imports that may not even meet UK fire safety regulations.

Rogue Traders Leaflet Local Residents

Rogue traders are leafleting residents offering roofing and driveway work. Rogue traders use bogus local addresses and telephone numbers linked to mobile phones. This makes them appear local but in reality they are very hard to trace. Rogue traders charge high prices and the work they carry out is poor and often unnecessary. Whether you receive a knock on the door or a flyer through your letterbox, you can't tell a good trader from a bad one under those circumstances.

Advice to Warwickshire Residents

- 1. Never buy goods or services from unexpected doorstep sellers
- 2. If in doubt, keep your door closed
- 3. To report a rogue trade to Trading Standards, phone Citizens Advice on 0808 223 1133

The Government's new NHS test and trace service is designed to trace people who might have come in to contact with someone who has coronavirus and help prevent the spread of the disease. Advice has been issued on how to spot fraudsters who may try to use NHS test and trace to steal personal and financial information and perpetrate scams.

If you test positive for coronavirus, the NHS test and trace service will send you a text or email alert or call you with instructions of how to share details of people with whom you have had close, recent contact and places you have visited.

The NHS test and trace service will also contact you if have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for coronavirus. Again, the alert will usually come by text, email or phone call.

Fraudsters may make telephone calls falsely claiming to be NHS test and trace staff or send bogus texts or emails.

If it's really NHS test and trace calling you it will be from their single number **0300 0135 000**, although scammers are known to be able to make their phone calls appear to come from genuine numbers. Scammers can also do this with text messages too and can even make messages appear in a chain of texts alongside previous genuine messages, making them look plausible.

That is why is it very important to understand what NHS contact tracers **will ask you to do** and what they **will never ask you to do**.

Contact tracers will:

- call you from 0300 013 5000
- send you text messages from 'NHS'
- ask you to sign into the NHS test and trace service website: <u>https://contact-tracing.phe.gov.uk/</u>
- ask for your full name and date of birth to confirm your identity, and postcode to offer support while self-isolating
- ask about the coronavirus symptoms you have been experiencing

• ask you to provide the name, telephone number and/or email address of anyone you have had close contact with in the 2 days prior to your symptoms starting

• ask if anyone you have been in contact with is under 18 or lives outside of England

Contact tracers will never:


- ask you to dial a premium rate number to speak to us (for example, those starting 09 or 087)
- ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product or any kind
- ask for any details about your bank account
- ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts
- ask you for any passwords or PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone
- disclose any of your personal or medical information to your contacts
- provide medical advice on the treatment of any potential coronavirus symptoms
- ask you to download any software to your PC or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet to anyone else
- ask you to access any website that does not belong to the government or NHS
