

ROYAL BRITISH LEGION OPENS NEW COMMUNITY HUB IN SOUTHAM

The Royal British Legion has opened a brand-new community hub and café in Southam, Warwickshire. Situated next to the RBL care home, Galanos House, the new hub will offer RBL support for those eligible for its services, as well housing a café open to the public, and meeting rooms.



Hub Manager, Alison Byerley said "The opening of the new hub and café has been a long time in the making, and we are excited to finally welcome people through the doors. We would love for people to come along on Monday 2nd May for our opening day to see and experience what the café and hub has to offer."

Local businesses will also be able to take advantage of the new community hub and café with the opportunity to hire out one of the three onsite rooms available. This includes a large hall, a treatment room, and small meeting room.

Jo-Anne Wilson MBE, Registered Manager at Galanos House said, "The new community hub will help provide support for RBL beneficiaries but will also be a fantastic space for residents of Southam and the surrounding villages."

Galanos House is a Royal British Legion care home for ex-service men and women. Opened in Southam in 2003 it has since become a pillar of the local community, which will only be boosted by the opening of the new Community Hub and Café.


As I write this, the League has still to be decided. We think it will be between Bishops and Long Itch... Watch this space!

Then when the fun had almost calmed down each child was given a Jubilee crown, to help them remember what fun they had had, in every way, that Jubilee Day.


There will also be a Bouncy Castle in the churchyard.

The next meeting of the parish council will be held on **Monday 13 June 2022** at 7.30pm at The Community Centre. Members of the public are welcome to attend and listen to the council's debate. A short time is set aside near the beginning of the meeting for members of the public to raise any matters relating to items on the agenda. The public is not permitted to take part in the council meeting itself so please make sure you raise any questions during the public forum. The minutes of the meetings are available on our website or from the parish clerk on request. The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council has just been held and Cllr Adam Dugmore was re-elected as Chairman for the forthcoming year and Councillor Judith Christian-Carter was re-elected Vice Chairman.



I'm afraid we have some sad and disappointing news this month. On our last visit to the orchard, we discovered that the cherry tree had been broken off along with several elder branches and one of the apple trees had been completely uprooted! The elder is not too bad as there are several of them and we cut them back ourselves during the winter. However, the damage to the cherry and apple trees is very disappointing, especially as last year was the first year that the cherry had enough fruit for us to sample before the birds ate them all.

No attempt had been made to hide the damaged trees and branches, so it is a bit of a mystery as to what happened. We did replant the apple tree in a slightly different place as it was intact but whether it will recover remains to be seen.

The wildflowers are really beginning to show on the Yellow Land now (and beyond on the Nature Reserve) and the rare butterflies will be on the wing – small blue, dingy skipper, grizzled skipper and green hairstreak. They are only around for a short period of time, so keep your eyes peeled if you're walking over there!




