A WALK AROUND THE CEMETERY: HARRIET DODD

On entering the cemetery, walk to the potting shed and there, on the right-hand side, four graves from the Spinney is the last resting place for Harriet Dodd. For some reason she was buried in unconsecrated ground, I do not know why, she was baptized, married in Church and died of natural causes. Perhaps over the years Harriet became a non-conformist.

Harriet was born in Avon Dassett, she was baptized at Avon Dassett Church on 25th September 1831. Her parents were John Barnes (born 1801) and Ann Barnes nee Baldwin (1801) Harriet's sibling were Elizabeth (1826), Mary (1827), William (1829), Caroline (1834) and John (1840). The Barnes family all lived in Avon Dassett, you can trace members of the family to 18c, all living at Avon Dassett.

By the time Harriet was 20 years old she was working as a house servant at Ratley Oxfordshire. The house held 9 servants, Harriet would have taken her orders from the Housekeeper and she would have done the washing of clothes and dishes, all by hand, no machines like we use today. Also, lighting the house fires each morning, changing bed linen etc. Harriet would have lived in the house, most likely had the top part of the house and she would also have been given a uniform to wear, plus limited amount of cash and one afternoon per week to use as she liked. All prepared the servants for married life.

Harriet married John Dodd of Bishops Itchington, they married on 25th November 1851 at Avon Dassett Church, moving to live at Bishops Itchington. The children of the marriage were all born in the village, Annice (1853), Catherine (1858), Harriet (1861), John (1868), Richard (1870) and Ruth (1875).

Harriet lost her son Richard in 1898, he had been married for 6 years and had a daughter aged 1 years. This must have been a great shock to Harriet owing to her elder son, John, moving to live in West Ham Essex and her daughter Ruth living with her husband Joseph Reading in Hemsworth Yorkshire. Harriet must have felt as if her family were slipping away as to travel to West Ham or Hemsworth would be a good day's journey for an elderly lady to travel.

Harriet was a very good dressmaker, most families made their own clothes, but she was well known for smocking stitch which is a delicate stitch used for wedding dresses and christening clothes. She did make her own wedding dress plus, when her daughters married, she made all the wedding outfits, remember all was done by hand.

As the children of the marriage left home, Catherine and Harriet stayed within the village. Catherine married a farmer, John Lea, he farmed Model Farm which is just past the railway bridge down Ladbroke Road. Harriet married Benjamin Clark who was born in Welton, Northamptonshire (they settled in Lower End). Annice married John Berry from a village family, they moved within walking distance of the village settling in Ladbroke. Richard and John travelled to settle in West Ham Essex with their families, Ruth was in Yorkshire.

As Harriet and John got older they decided to move and live at Model Farm with Catherine and her husband, John Lea. They had three children plus a servant Thomas Ali Worrall whose family were well known in the village.

Harriet was buried on 31st December 1906, followed by her husband John on 29th March 1911. Descendants of Harriet still live in the area.


