Remembrance 2021

This year is the centenary of the Royal British Legion – and we are delighted to continue to support them, especially given their support locally through Galanos House.

This year, our Remembrance time will be affected for another year by the current situation. We are only able to have a limited number in church, with seats distanced, and people still encouraged to wear a face covering for their and others' safety. The infection rate locally is high and having a significant effect on our schools (both staff and pupils) and we need to make sure that whatever we do is as safe as we can.

The suggestion is therefore that we have a display in the church porch as we did last year, and that we hold a short remembrance service outside in the churchyard so that those who wish to can parade and wreaths laid as usual. We will endeavour to have some external PA so that people can hear.

We plan to start this at 10.45am

There will also be something online as we did last year for those who wish to either remember at home or use on the 11^{th} itself. The link details will be circulated early that week via our church website and village Facebook pages – so do feel free to share the links widely so that all have a chance to share in this act of remembrance.

Living with Loss

We have also had a **Living with Loss** service in the past on Remembrance Day evening and I am planning to do that this year, opening the church at 6.00pm until 7.30pm. There will be a short act of worship at the start to which you are very welcome, but this is really a peaceful space for us to light a candle and sit a while, for as little or as long as we like.

Many of us have faced loss in all kinds of ways – not simply the loss of a loved one. This quiet space allows us to bring those different senses and experiences of loss and know that we aren't alone.

A WALK AROUND THE CEMETERY : MISS MARY ADA SLEATH

Walk into the Cemetery and, after the Chapel, count 11 rows on your righthand side and you will see the last resting place of Mary Ada Sleath. She was born at Wollaston, Northamptonshire in 1860. Mary's father, John, was born 1828 in Stagsden Bedfordshire. His wife Elizabeth, nee Marriot, was born in 1831 at St Marylebone Middlesex, she was a well- known dressmaker. Mary's sibling were Elizabeth Agnes (born 1859, died 1863) Alice 1863, Annie 1864 and her only brother John 1867. The family always lived in Wollaston.

Mary's father died on 6th October 1869, which must have been a great shock for the family. John was a carpenter, a master trader and, when probate was settled, he left £78.15s to his wife. With part of this money, Elizabeth and her young family of 4 moved to live at 'Duck End', Wollaston. Before John passed away the family lived with her parents, who were tea dealers and grocers. Mary had become a governess at the local school. She enjoyed this work and decided to become a teacher, taking on the role of pupil teacher at Wollaston infant school she qualified in July 1879. Sister Alice was always a dressmaker and later in life she became a ladies companion living in Newman Street, Kettering. Sister Annie also went into a different type of teaching. She was the 1st president of Gold Street Women's Adult School, she fought for adults to learn and later in life she supported for women to have the vote. Mary's only brother emigrated in the 1870s to America, he married Evelyn Grover in 1894 they lived in Wisconsin for the rest of their lives.

Mary and her sisters stayed in Wollaston often visiting friends of their school lives. Mary moved to become head teacher at Bishops Itchington in the late 1800s. I wonder if she was informed of the appointment by James Walton's family. He and his wife Ellen both came from Northamptonshire, family may have lived near Wollaston? Mary lodged with the Steel family. Head of the family was George who worked at the Cement Works. After living in Works Lane, the family moved into a works cottage near the school. This may have been Co-op Terrace or a cottage in Fisher Road (which in the 1800s was named Dark Lane), it would have been at this time Mary lived with the Steel family. By 1911, Mary had moved to live alone in one of the cottages in Saucy Six, she stayed in this cottage for the rest of her life.

When Mary's mother passed away on 11th July 1906 her estate went to probate, she left everything she owned to Reverend Arthur Lester who was the Baptist minister.

This amount was £204.19s.7p, it must have been a great shock to her children if she had not informed them of her will. With Mary teaching, Alice working with Adult women and Annie living in Kettering as seamstress and ladies companion at least they had always worked for a living, therefore would have savings.

Mary taught many of today's village families. If your relations were living in village from 1890s to mid-1900s they would have had Mary teaching them in the infant school. She was a good teacher and the infant school became the scene of the early development of Nursery schools. The building always had the fire lit, which was welcoming on a winter's day, it had a large guard around the fire so children could not get burnt. Mary often let the children have a dressing up day, she and her sister used to make some of the outfits owing to having poor families not able to make or afford the outfits. When WWI finished in 1918, Mr and Mrs Lakin arranged a tea party for all the village children, they also gave each child some sweets and a medal with Kings head on one side and 1914 – 1918 on the other the medal was also had a red, white and blue ribbon plus a pin to hang on your clothes, I wonder if any ancestors have one of these medals?

After Mary retired from teaching, she stayed in the village and did a lot of work for the Congregational Chapel which has now been converted to a house in Chapel Street. She helped many of the poorer families when they needed help, Mary was greatly respected in the village. In December 1934 she was taken ill and passed away on 14th December, when her will was read she had left everything to her unmarried sisters Alice and Annie, this amounted to £1651.2s.1p. Once her sisters had died no family were left in England, her brother John did have family (which would be Mary's nieces) but I expect they never met John or his family when he moved to live in America.

Mary was buried on 12th December 1934 on unconsecrated ground, I do not know the reason why, she had been baptised and was a believer in God. The funeral was conducted by Mr F Castle a member of the Congregational Chapel.

I can remember my father and uncle talking about Miss Sleath, and expect many of the families have passed down some memory of Miss Mary Ada Sleath,

They are sending imitation text messages, emails and making phone calls pretending to be from the NHS, and offering fake vaccine certificates for sale online and through social media.



If you are contacted about your NHS COVID Pass:

- Be alert to links and attachments in unexpected text messages or emails
- Do not respond to requests for money, passwords or financial details
- Challenge: Could it be fake?

The NHS COVID Pass is available to demonstrate your COVID-19 status either in a digital or paper format via the NHS App, the NHS website or by calling 119.

SOUTHAM HAS A NEW MARKET!

A new indoor market with the theme 'Shop Local' will take place in Southam on the third Saturday of the month. The first market will be on November 20th and the venue is the Grange Hall on Coventry Road. It is being organised by volunteers from Southam First, with Southam WI providing the refreshments.

Although Southam is an ancient market town, and was awarded its market charter nearly 800 years ago, its weekly Tuesday



market ceased in early 2020 and there are currently no plans to revive it. However, inspired by the popularity of indoor markets in nearby villages, Southam First's volunteers are arranging for a new monthly indoor market to take place on Saturdays from 10am to 12.30pm.

The organisers hope to attract visitors from both Southam and the surrounding villages, and aim to provide a wide range of goods for sale, including food and drink, home and garden wares, gifts, crafts and clothes, emphasising local producers & retailers. Alongside the stalls, the market will also be a showcase for Southam's shops and services, with space for them to display their publicity material.

There has been a very enthusiastic response to the idea of a Saturday market. The volunteers believe that the experience of lockdown helped people to rediscover the importance of community and supporting local producers. They are confident that the market will be very popular. Holding the market on a Saturday morning will ensure that those who are not available on weekdays will also be able to go.

The dates for the first four markets are: 20th November, 18th December, 19th February and 19th March. (There will be no market in January 2022 because the Hall has a prior booking.) If the market proves to be popular with both stallholders and customers, then it will continue indefinitely on the third Saturday of every month.


